Bible Scholar Tasks and Answers

Parents: The following information and answers are for your eyes only. Use the "answers" provided to help you guide your child towards becoming a Bible Scholar. Begin your work together as soon as possible so that your child has plenty of time to fully comprehend and learn the material. You may begin with any task that you want. Bible Scholar Adults will be available to meet with your child beginning in January. When your child feels they have successfully completed a task, they should bring their Bible Scholar card and any applicable "proof" with them to the Children's Hosmer Library. The Bible Scholar Adult will punch your child's card if the task has been completed satisfactorily. The deadline to complete all tasks is the end of May. Those who complete all 11 tasks will be recognized as Bible scholars during worship on the last day of Sunday school. Many thanks for the support and encouragement you will give your child.

- **Attend 10 Sunday school lessons**

After our child has attended 10 Sunday school classes, they should have their Sunday school teacher sign the back of their Bible Scholar card.

- **Read and retell two Bible Stories:**

Moses and the Wanderings (OT) Exodus 1-20

Be familiar with Moses birth, Burning Bush, Plagues, Crossing the Sea, Ten Commandments

Parable of the Good Samaritan (NT) Luke 10:25-37

- **How are the books of bible divided? What are the parts called?**

The Old Testament is divided into 5 parts: Law, History, Poetry, Major Prophets, Minor Prophets

The New Testament is divided into 5 parts: Gospels, History, Paul's Letters, General Letters, Prophecy

- **Memorize and recite:**

Proverbs 3:5 Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding

John 14:6 Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

- **Write your own ACCTS prayer**

Use the following as a guide. Use your own words and ideas.

Adoration is offering love and praise to God

Father, everything is possible for you.

Confession is telling the truth. It does not have to be about sin

Father, you know everything I have done without me even telling you.

Consecration is setting something apart for God

Lord, I offer you the words that I speak today.

Thanksgiving is offering thanks to God

Thank you Lord, for loving me.

Supplication is asking God for something

Father, please protect my grandparents while they travel

- **Name the 9 Fruit of the Spirit found in Galatians 5:22**

Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, Self-Control

- **Tell about David. What were his occupations? How is he best known?**

Find a book in the Resource Room or Hosmer Library that gives a description of people in the Bible.

David was: the King of Israel, a shepard boy, a military commander, court musician

Best known for being the greatest king in Israel's history, most significant ancestor of Jesus Christ, killing Goliath the giant and for writing 73 out of the 150 Psalms in the Old Testament.

God described David as "a man after my own heart".

- **Explain the season of Lent. What are some ways to observe it?**

"Lent" is derived from the English "Lente" which means springtime.

It is the 40-day period of repentance and renewal preceding Easter.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the Easter service.

Holy Week commemorates Christ's last week of life on earth. It's the final, most important part of Lent.

Lent is: a special time of prayer and penitential practices.

increased understanding of Christ's sacrifice and Resurrection

renewal of baptismal vows and recommitment to the Christian life.

The Lenten period allows us time to recall the Easter story and absorb its meaning. Christ lived and died to redeem the world from sin. Because of Christ's death and Resurrection, our lives can be renewed: we can renounce sin and begin to live for God.

Ideas of ways to observe Lent:

- Set a pattern for doing something positive
- Follow a "Lenten Calendar" (Copies in the Resource Room)
- Come to the Family Lenten Worship service /Soup and Bread Suppers
- Write an "I wonder" letter to God. Think through your questions about life and faith.
- Keep a prayer journal
